Arrival Information

CHECK IN: Check in no later than **60** minutes before performance time. Your band-host will meet you upon arrival outside.

WARM UP: Your band will be escorted to the warmup location upon check in. You will be able to store instrument cases and extra equipment in a separate storage area following your student sessions. Bands will be escorted to the Performance Room 10 minutes prior to down beat.

PERFORMANCE: You will have a **30-minute** time slot with adjudicators. **This includes set up and tear down.** It is recommended that you perform 10- to 15-minutes of music followed by a 10 to 15-minute adjudication.

If a band chooses the competitive ensemble class, immediately following your performance/adjudication, your band will be escorted to a sight reading room.

Sight Reading Rules

- No one may look at parts until the adjudicator gives instructions.
- Once musicians are set up, the director may look at the score for one minute. At the end of that minute, they can signal the band members that they may look at their parts. The director may go over parts with the members for four minutes, but no playing is to be done.
- At the end of the four minutes, the selection is to be played straight through without pause.

College, High School, and Middle School Big Band & Combo Winners

- A. Honor Band: Competitive schools in each class are eligible for this award, which is presented to the school with the highest overall averaged score awarded by the adjudicators.
- B. One Honor Band from each category will be invited to perform one number on one of the main stage concerts.
